# What Is An Interval?

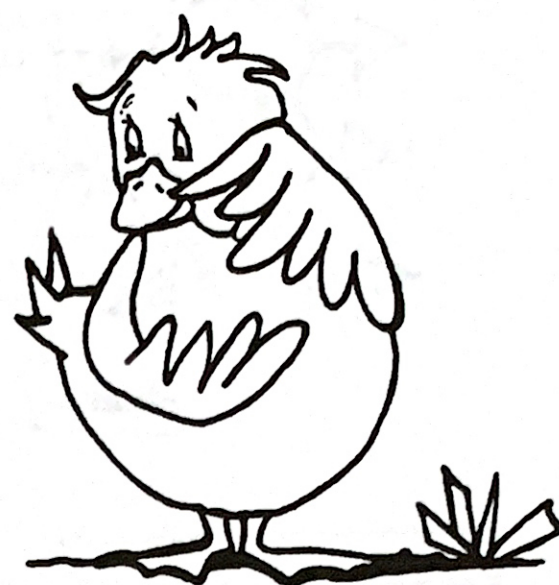
An interval is the distance from one note to another.

When you go from C to D, you use 2 notes and 2 note names.  
This interval is called a second.

The intervals are:

1 - first  
2 - second  
3 - third  
4 - fourth

5 - fifth  
6 - sixth  
7 - seventh  
8 - octave
